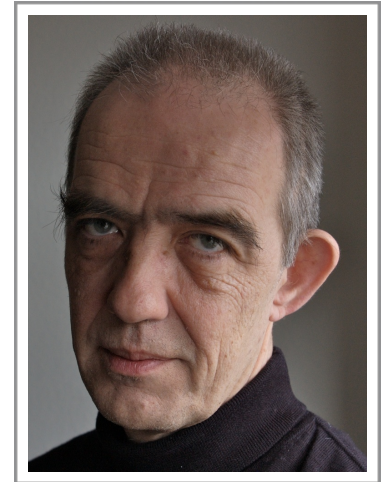

Since his studies at the University of Edinburgh, Patrick has worked as composer, MD and actor for many different theatres.

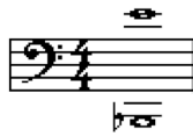
